Role-Specific Insights

Registered Nurse (RN)

- **Role**: Provides direct patient care, assesses symptoms, assists in care planning, and educates patients and their families. RNs are essential in diverse healthcare settings, often serving as the primary point of contact for patient care.
- **Education Requirements**: Requires an ADN or BSN and passing the NCLEX-RN exam for licensure. A BSN is increasingly preferred or required by employers.
- Certification: Licensure as an RN requires passing the NCLEX-RN and state certification.
- Average Salary: \$89,010 per year BLS, 2022.
- **Job Outlook**: 6% growth from 2022-2032 (As fast as average) BLS.

Nurse Practitioner (NP)

- **Role**: Provides advanced clinical care, diagnoses and treats illnesses, prescribes medications, and manages overall patient care. NPs often specialize in areas like family practice, pediatrics, or geriatrics and can operate with a high degree of autonomy.
- Education Requirements: Requires a BSN followed by a Master's or Doctoral degree in Nursing (MSN/DNP), along with NP certification in a chosen specialty area.
- **Certification**: Certification is available through the ANCC or AANP, and NPs must also be licensed by the state in which they practice.
- Average Salary: \$124,680 per year BLS, 2022.
- **Job Outlook**: 37% growth from 2022-2032 (Much faster than average) BLS.

Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA)

• Role: Administers anesthesia, monitors patients' vital signs during procedures, and manages post-anesthesia recovery. CRNAs play a critical role in pain management and patient safety during surgical and other medical procedures.



- Education Requirements: Requires a BSN, followed by a Master's or Doctoral degree in Nurse Anesthesia (MSN/DNP), with 1-2 years of critical care experience as an RN.
- **Certification**: Must pass the National Certification Examination for Nurse Anesthetists (NBCRNA) and obtain state licensure to practice as a CRNA.
- **Average Salary**: \$203,090 per year BLS, 2022.
- **Job Outlook**: 9% growth from 2022-2032 (Faster than average) BLS.
